GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. The Carving Competitions are open to all wood carvers. Carvers are not limited to the number of categories they wish to enter but they are limited to 2 carvings per category or sub-category.
- 2. The same carving may not be entered more than once, except for Class Purchase Awards.
- 3. A carver can enter in only 1 (one) class. Since the Sponsor Purchase Awards are not considered "Classes", a carver may enter carvings in the Sponsor PA, and others in his or her designated class, this provided that rules #1and #2 are adhered to.
- 4. The Rules Committee of The Canadian Woodcarving Championship reserves the right to accept or reject any entry or entries in all categories and to display only those exhibits that are acceptable quality or that exhibit space may permit.
- 5. While the Hamilton Wood Show and The Canadian Woodcarving Championship agree to take every reasonable precaution to ensure the safety of carvings in the show, it must be understood that carvers are required to directly assume all risks of loss or damage.
- 6. Should any article be accidentally damaged, lost or stolen, The Hamilton Wood Show / CWC will render all assistance in their power for the recovery of the same, but will not recognize any claim for payment of the value or any portion thereof.
- 7. If the question is raised as to the carver's production, ownership, or right to compete, the carver shall, if the Rules Committee requires, make a statutory declaration that the article in question is the production and property of the carver.
- 8. Carvers must make their own choice as to the class and category in which they enter carvings. However, the Rules Committee reserve the right to transfer any carvings from one category to another, to combine any category or categories where the number of entries is not sufficient to provide competition.
- 9. The right to alter, interpret, amend, add to or cancel any of these rules or to grant relaxation from them in individual cases is reserved to the Rules Committee in their absolute discretion. Should any questions arise not provided for in these rules and regulations, the decision of the Rules Committee of the Canadian Woodcarving Championship shall be final.

1st Carving = \$10, any Additional Carving(s) = \$5

Pay when delivering carvings at the show - at the times indicated in the Agenda. Carvings will not be accepted at times other than those shown for Carving Registration in the Agenda.

Entries can be brought in by other than the actual carver, provided the carver has filled in and signed the Entry Form. This 'Courier' approach is encouraged. The <u>CARVER</u> is responsible for, and must acquire, his or her claim ticket and entry pass. These are absolutely necessary for the claiming of a carving on Sunday the 30th at 5:00 p.m.

CARVING GUIDELINES

- 1. All Classes, all Categories.
 - 1. All carvings must be the sole work of the entrant. It is strongly recommended that all carvings be signed & dated. (However, this should be covered)
 - 2. All carvings must have been completed within the last 12 months, January 2010 to January 2011.
 - 3. Entries from previous CWC's are prohibited
 - 4. All entries must be made of wood. Except for Category 20 see Category Clarifications below
 - 5. Glass eyes are accepted.
 - 6. Other materials may be used as functionally required. i.e.. Hinges, hasps, drawer pulls, cane tips, etc.
 - 7. Where a Wildfowl size is specified, that dimension shall be measured from the base of the Bill to the end of the Body (Pygostyle) using a tape measure. (Done this way at World's 2007).
- 2. OPEN CLASS
 - 1. Other materials may be used for habitat, bases, and structural purposes but must be hand formed.
 - 2. The use of real rocks, uncarved driftwood, etc. is NOT accepted.

3. INTERMEDIATE CLASS

- 1. Other materials may be used for habitat, bases, and structural purposes but must be hand formed.
- 2. The use of real rocks, un-carved driftwood, etc. (for habitat or bases) is discouraged.

4. NOVICE CLASS & YOUTH

1. Other materials may be used for habitat, bases, and structural purposes. i.e. pewter feet, driftwood, etc.

CATEGORY CLARIFICATIONS

General – All Wildfowl and Wildlife categories include domestic breeds.

Category 5 - Waterfowl

5A - Working Decoys

Must be life size, practical and durable. Combing, blending, scratch painting and stippling is acceptable but no burning or texturing. Decoys may be floated and must self right from any position. Geese, swans and their sub species will be required to self- right from the side only.

5B – Smoothies & Realistic

Basically a decorative decoy. Life size. Will not be floated. Decorative painting is encouraged but no feather burning or other fine texturing. Delineation of feather groups and of the bill and elevated primaries is acceptable. There should be minimal feather sculpting and texturing.

<u>Category 6 - Human Figures - 'In the Round' - Realistic or Stylized</u> Includes busts, heads, and other body parts.

Category 7 - Caricatures

Any subject. Must have exaggerated features. Carving knife marks preferable.

Category 9 – Abstract and Interpretive

Abstract - a creation that does not resemble any known subject

Interpretive - The artist's perception of a known subject but the creation is not detailed enough to be stylized.

Category 20 - Other Media

For carvings done in Soap Stone, Bone, Antlers, Golf Balls, Nuts, etc. All Rules, Regulations & Carving Guidelines apply. There will be one Class including all categories. The winner will **not** be eligible for the Best of Show competition.

<u>Categories 21 - Marquetry</u> A separate competition, on a trial basis, with one (1) Class and a separate prize pool. All **Rules, Regulations, & Carving Guidelines** apply. There will be one class including all Categories. The winner will **not** be eligible for the Best of Show competition. The size of entries should, in general, be comparable to entries in the other competitions. **No Furniture.** If in doubt, call Bill Carey at 905-574-7498.

In the subject line, please put "Category Classification: CWC 2011"

Space for hanging entries is limited, so, when possible, a suitable stand should be provided by the carver. Please tag the stand for identification.

COMPETITION LEVELS

OPEN CLASS

 For those carvers or professionals who have won a 1st Best of Show OR, have won an Intermediate 1st Best of Class OR a total of Ten (10) 1st place ribbons at the Intermediate level in recognized Carving Competitions.

INTERMEDIATE CLASS

- For carvers who have advanced beyond the Novice stage and who have won, as a Novice, a 1st, 2nd, or 3rd Best of Show, OR a Novice Best of Class, OR Five (5) 1st place ribbons at the Novice level in recognized Carving Competitions.
- A Carver, who has won a first place ribbon in the Open Class, OR a 1st Best of Show, OR an Intermediate 1st Best of Class, OR Ten (10) 1st in Intermediate, may NOT enter Intermediate.

NOVICE CLASS

- Open to any carver who has yet to win Five (5) 1st place ribbons in recognized Carving Competitions.
- NOTE: A carver, who has won a first place ribbon in the Intermediate Class, OR a 1st, 2nd, or 3rd Best of Show, OR a Novice 1st Best of Class, OR Five (5)-1st in Novice, may NOT enter Novice.

YOUTH CLASSES

Youth 1 – 12 years and under

Youth 2 - 13 to 15 Years.

No class or category segregation. All entries, in each Class will be judged together.

BEST OF CLASS

All 1st place winners of each Category in that Class are eligible.

BEST OF SHOW

The 1st, 2nd, & 3rd place winners of the Open, Intermediate & Novice BEST OF CLASS competitions are eligible.

See Judging Procedure for Best of Show – in Judging Criteria.

JUDGING CRITERIA

It is recognized that "Judging" is the most controversial and difficult part of any competition. Everything possible will be done to make the judging, in the CWC, as fair & equitable as possible. Each entry will be judged on what was done, not on what was not done.

GROUP 1 (Categories 1 – 3)

- 1. Degree of Complexity
- 2. Skilled Execution
- 3. Accuracy (including Painting)
- 4. Life-like presence, Essence
- 5. Artistry, Originality, Creativity

GROUP 2 (Category 5)

- 1. Degree of Complexity
- 2. Skilled Execution
- 3. Accuracy
- 4. Artistry
- 5. Durability

GROUP 3 (Categories 4 & 6 - 9)

- 1. Degree of Complexity
- 2. Skilled Execution
- 3. Life-like presence, Essence
- 4. Painting &/or Finish
- 5. Artistry, Originality, Creativity

GROUP 4 (Category 10 –15)

- 1. Degree of Complexity
- 2. Skilled Execution
- 3. Perspective
- 4. Painting &/or Finish
- 5. Artistry, Originality, Creativity
- All Purchase Awards, will be judged as per groups 1, 2, 3, & 4; depending on the subject's category.
- When a carving is entered in the Class Purchase Award and the appropriate general competition, it will be judged as a Purchase Award first, and then moved to the General Class Judging.

JUDGING PROCEDURE FOR BEST OF SHOW

- Qualifying 1st, 2nd, & 3rd Best of Class
- 1st Best of Show: Judge 1st Best of Class 3 pieces
- 2nd Best of Show: Judge those remaining from 1st Best of Show Judging & the eligible
 2nd Best of Class 3 pieces
- 3rd Best of Show: Judge those remaining from 2nd Best of Show & the next eligible piece 3 pieces.

PLEASE TAKE SPECIAL NOTE OF THE FOLLOWING

- 1. To be judged separately, a category should have a minimum of 3 entries. Failing this, that category may be combined with others in the same judging criteria group.
- 2. To be judged separately, a sub-category should have a minimum of 3 entries. Failing this, that sub-category may be combined with others in the same category.
- 3. This is at the discretion of the Rules Committee. (See General Rules and Regulations, #8 & #9)
- 4. 1st, 2nd, 3rd and Honourable Mention Ribbons will be awarded regardless of the number of carvings entered in a category.
